

# Nature-Based Solutions Education Network (NBS EduWORLD) | NBS Education Summit 2025

The high-level Nature-Based Solutions Education Summit aims to bridge science, policy, and practice by presenting key findings from NBS EduWORLD and other NBS education projects to the public, EU policymakers, and Ministries of Education. Its focus is on **supporting nature-based solutions (NBS) education through policy**, with a special emphasis on just transitions. The event will include a policy learning session, showcasing best practices and testing recommendations with policymakers. Conclusions will inform EU policy recommendations, while participants can explore real-life NBS education examples, including those from NBS EduWORLD and other related projects.
