MOBILITY IN SCHOOL EDUCATION

- The Key Action 1 (KA1) supports schools and other organisations active in the field of school education that want to organise learning mobility activities for school pupils and staff. A wide range of activities are supported, including:
 - job shadowing
 - professional development courses for staff
 - individual and group mobility for pupils
 - invited experts





OBJECTIVES OF THE ACTION

- Increasing the quality of teaching and learning in school education by:
 - supporting professional development of teachers, school leaders, and other school staff;
 - promoting the use of new technologies and innovative teaching methods;
 - improving language learning and language diversity in schools;
 - supporting the sharing and transferring of best practices in teaching and school development.
- Contributing to the creation of the European Education Area by:
 - building capacity of schools to engage in cross-border exchanges and cooperation, and carry out high-quality mobility projects;
 - making learning mobility a realistic possibility for any pupil in school education;
 - fostering recognition of learning outcomes of pupils and staff in mobility periods abroad.







WHAT IS NEW IN ERASMUS+

Applications are submitted by schools The application for accreditation includes a 'European school development plan", the Erasmus Plan

Names of school staff and specific dates do not have to be listed in the application

The school applies for a project that can include more than one activity → training courses or partnerships with other European schools One single application per school for all planned training activities abroad during a specific period (from 6 to 18 months)

Your school needs to apply for you, as well as for any other of your colleagues!

One application date per year Next Deadline: 19 February 2025





HOW TO ACCESS ERASMUS+ MOBILITY OPPORTUNITIES

Short-term projects for mobility of pupils and staff

These projects provide applicants with an opportunity to organise various mobility activities over a period of **6 to 18 months**. Short-term projects are the best choice for organisations applying for Erasmus+ **for the first time, or for those that wish to organise only a limited number of activities**.

Accredited projects for mobility of pupils and staff

These projects are open only to organisations holding an **Erasmus accreditation** in the field of school education. This special funding strand allows accredited organisations to regularly receive funding for mobility activities that contribute to the gradual implementation of their Erasmus Plan.





- ✓ The possibility of Erasmus accreditation for Key Action 1 (KA1) is one of the most interesting developments for schools involved in the new Erasmus+ programme (2021-2027).
- A school needs to be accredited only once in the seven years of the Programme (2021-2027). This is sufficient in order to make it recognized by the National Agency as an organization that deals with international mobility on a regular basis. Hence, the school that receives the Accreditation will not need to apply again for it within the 2021-2027 Programme.
- ✓ To apply, educational institutions have to outline their own strategy for medium- and long-term internationalization and modernization by presenting an Erasmus+ Plan

(School Development Plan based on Erasmus+ Funding).






- ✓ Straightforward and simple way to benefit from Erasmus+.
- ✓ Limitation on the number of participants and the duration of the project.
- \checkmark The format is open only to individual organisations and not to consortiums.
- ✓ Accredited organisations cannot apply for short-term projects since they already have permanent access to Erasmus+ funding.
- ✓ The application for short-term projects includes a list and description of activities that the applicant organisation plans to organise.






THE APPLICATION TIPS

The needs of the school in terms of quality development and internationalisation: What are the areas or competences that you need to improve in your school?

E.g. staff competences, language competences - possibly linked with European dimension, skills for new teaching methods and tools, school management and organisation.

- \checkmark Carefully monitor the actual needs in every aspect of your school \rightarrow organize a meeting with the rest of the staff.
- ✓ Identify specific training (courses etc.) or mobility activities that can serve those needs.
- ✓ Study carefully their objectives, methods, and skills / competences they are addressing.
 e.g. Consult the Published Description, Aim, and Learning Objectives by the NBS EduWORLD training providers
- Clearly link those needs with the improvement of the quality of education offered by your school and with reaching European standards.
- Add information on the profile of the school to support the needs that you identified: e.g. Area of the school, socioeconomic background, type of school, students and students' families' backgrounds, possible drop-out rates, access to other European schools, teachers and staff's skills and needs to deal with possible obstacles.



KA1 APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Step 1: Check Eligibility

✓ Obtain an Organization ID (OID) by registering your organization on the Erasmus+ platform

(https://webgate.ec.europa.eu/erasmus-esc) if you don't have one.

Step 2: Conduct a Needs Analysis

 Identify your organization's strengths and areas for improvement and professional development aligned with school's strategy.

Example: Green competences development or innovative teaching strategies.

- ✓ Link needs to your school's Development Plan (objectives and outcomes).
- ✓ Link identified needs to planned activities (e.g., teacher training, job shadowing).
- ✓ Emphasize how activities will benefit students, teachers, and the school.





KA1 APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Step 3: Draft the Proposal

- Define Objectives: Clear and measurable objectives for professional development.
 Example: "Improve teacher competences in project-based learning by participating in training workshops."
- ✓ Describe Planned Activities: Detail the type, duration, and location of activities Example: "A one-week course in Greece on teaching for sustainability."
- Specify Outcomes and Impact: Specify how these activities will improve teaching quality.
 Example: "Integrate project-based learning to enhance critical thinking in students."
- ✓ Provide a realistic timeline for activities implementation and follow-up actions.





KA1 APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Step 4: Plan the Budget

- ✓ Categories include:
 - Travel: Costs for teachers traveling abroad.
 - Subsistence: Accommodation/daily expenses.
- Course Fees: Up to €80/day for structured courses.
- Organizational Support: Administrative costs for the school.
- ✓ Be realistic but thorough.
- ✓ Ensure the budget aligns with your proposed activities.

Step 5: Submit the Application

 \checkmark Complete all required sections in the

Erasmus+ Application Portal.

- ✓ Attach necessary documents, including:
 - Proof of OID registration.
 - Authorization letters from your school.
- ✓ Double-check for completeness and

consistency before submission.






